

BOIL WATER NOTICE

Loss of pressure in Village of South Blooming Grove. Impacting homes on Ft. Worth Place, Dallas Drive, Houston Ave., and Kingsville Drive.

BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING

Bring tap water to a rolling boil, boil for one minute, and cool before using. Or use bottled water certified for sale by the New York State Department of Health. Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, making ice, washing dishes, brushing teeth, and preparing food until further notice.

This Boil Water Notice applies to customers on the following streets: Ft. Worth Place, Dallas Drive, Houston Ave., and Kingsville Drive

What Happened?

At about 9:00 AM on Monday 1/26/2026 the water system lost pressure at the high elevations of our system due to inclement weather impacting our ability to truck in adequate water supply.

When water mains lose pressure it increases the chance that untreated water and harmful microbes can enter your water.

Harmful microbes in drinking water can cause diarrhea, cramps, nausea, headaches, or other symptoms and may pose a special health risk for infants, some elderly, and people with severely compromised immune systems. But these symptoms are not just caused by microbes in drinking water. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you should seek medical advice.

What is being done?

Tankers were brought in and water pressure was restored. Samples to lift the boil water order are being collected over the next few days and you will be notified when you no longer need to boil your water.

It is likely that you will need to boil water for the next few days until we receive the results of samples. You will be informed when tests show that you no longer need to boil your water.
